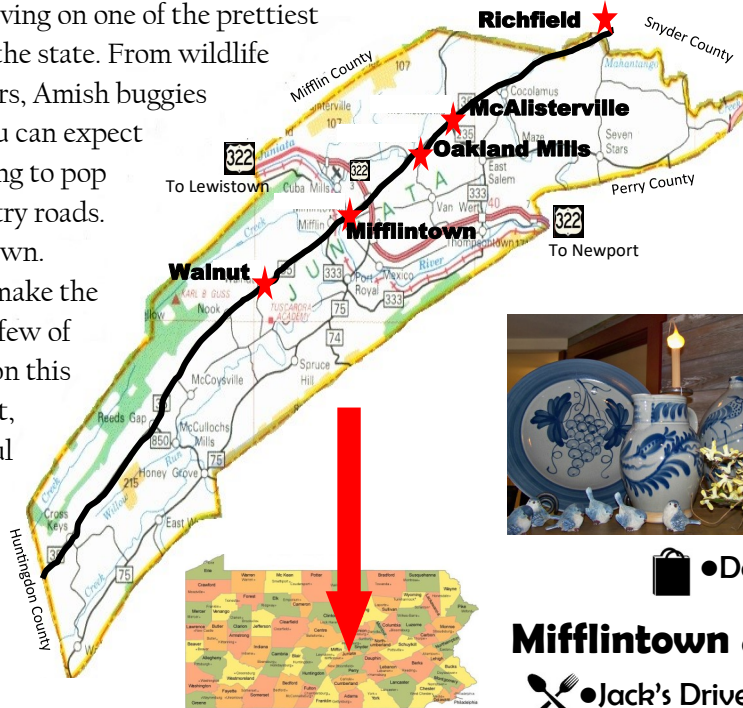




Juniata County, PA
