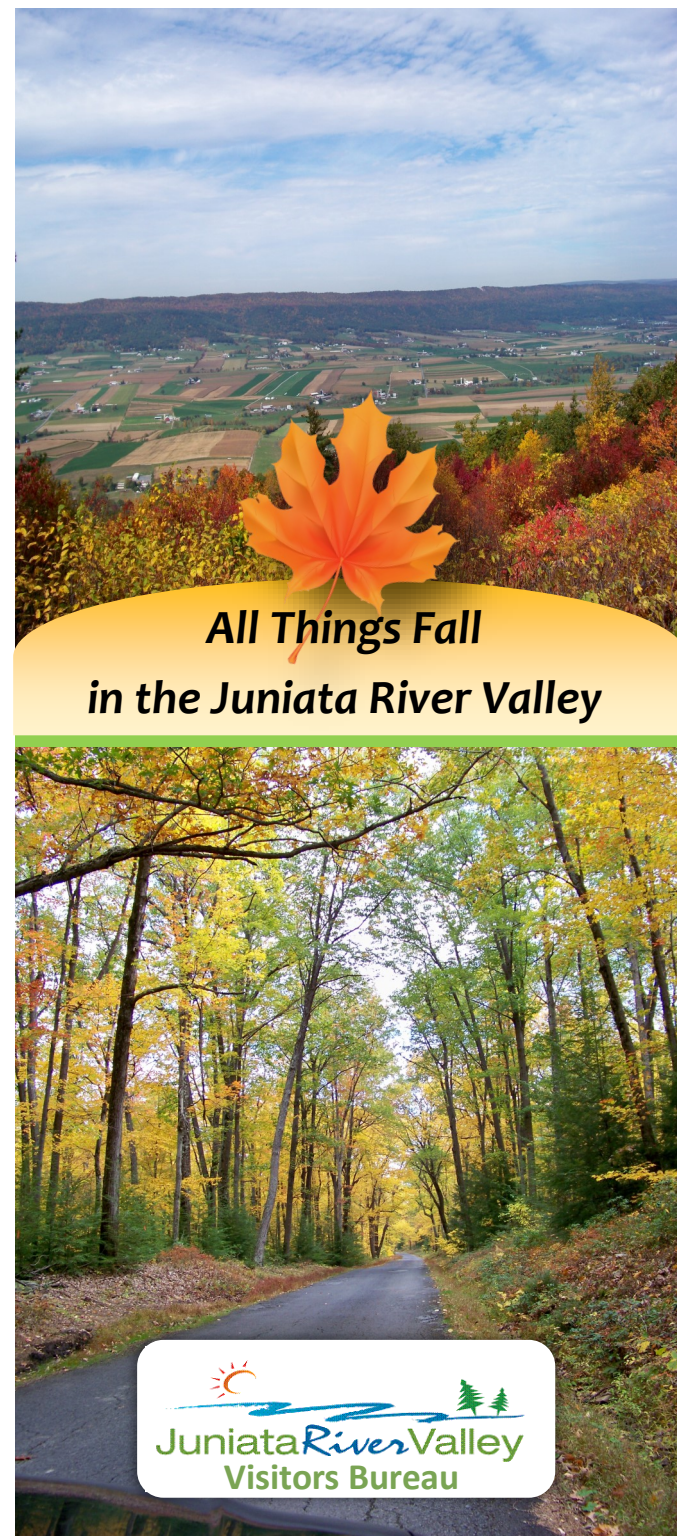

Trails

Towpath Trail at Lewistown Narrows Canal Park- 3 mile hiking trail with informational signs throughout the trail explaining the history of the Pennsylvania canal.

Alan Seeger Natural Area- Travel down Stone Creek Road, Huntingdon for about 7.4 miles. You will see Alan Seeger Natural Area on your left. Starting at the parking area, walk a short distance along Stone Creek Road until you see a sign showing the route of the trail.

S.H. Rothermel Walking Trail- the multi-purpose recreation trail along the Juniata River in Mifflin County offers views of the Juniata River and the Victory Park Veterans Mural.

Cycling on the Road- Five tours are highlighted under the Juniata River Region destination option at www.thealleghenies.com

Across the Juniata River Valley in the fall, the leaves turn into beautiful shades of red, orange and yellow. We have gathered up a few of our favorite places where you can take advantage of the scenery to the absolute fullest.

Jack's Mountain- This view gives leaf peepers the chance to see into two different valleys. Big Valley is to the North, and Ferguson Valley and McVeytown is to the South. Turn onto PA-655 Belleville. Turn left onto Wills Rd. and continue on Jack's Mountain Rd to the top. From Rt 522, McVeytown turn right onto Jack's Mountains Rd & continue to the top of the mountain.

Penns View Overlook- From State College follow Rt. 45 east. About 5 miles after Spring Mills follow signs to Poe Valley State Park and/or Poe Paddy Picnic Area. Cross Penns Creek on the Millheim Pike and head up the mountain. Turn left on Pine Swamp Road and left on Poe Paddy Drive. Penns View is at the top of the ridge.

Big Valley Vista- Siglerville/Milheim Pike. From Siglerville, follow signs to Poe Valley State Park. See unobstructed views of Big Valley.

Take A Drive Down...

- A. Rt. 322/ Lewistown Narrows
- B. Rt. 322 Mann Narrows, Reedsville
- C. Take a drive through Big Valley, Located on Route 655, Belleville. Make sure you give yourself plenty of time, because you will want to stop at many places along the way!
- D. Ferguson Valley Road- From Burnham to Aitkinson Mills
- E. New Lancaster Valley Road- A Large area of woodland that lays adjacent to Reeds Gap
- F. Victory Park - A Veterans Memorial Park located along the Juniata Valley River. The path is lined with vintage style street lamps and Zelkova trees. It's beautiful in every season but the leaves on the trees in the fall are a show stopper.
