
Downtown Lewistown-


the bricks were made can be easily found throughout this narrow valley.




Dawn and dusk are the best times to try to catch a glimpse of one of the bald eagles as they fish in the river. They like to


River Access-

The Lewistown Narrows-**Earliest**

Settlers struggled through this natural gorge without room for a decent path. Five stages of transportation traversed this area: rafts on the Juniata River, boats on the PA Canal, wagons on the dirt road turnpike, trains on the railroad, and cars on the current four lane highway. The road you see now across the river is an engineering feat. One of the two specially designed retaining walls is the longest in the nation and the second longest in the world.



Bridge-Get out of the car and stretch your legs! Find it by turning off Rt. 333 onto Rt. 35E and then left onto 3008 River Drive. Don't cross the river or you've missed it.

Lehman Covered Bridge-

Rebuilt after Hurricane Agnes with salvaged timbers from the original 1858 bridge, The Lehman is on the Ntl. Register of Historic Places. The bridge is on private property. Please do not trespass!

Tuscarora Springs House - This private residence is modeled after a 1920s railroad station.
